Three Shocking Truths Sam Dilbeck

There are three things God wants everyone to know: God loves you; God wants you; but God doesn't accept you the way you are. On the other hand, the devil has been trying to convince people God doesn't love them, doesn't want them, and that he accepts them the way they are. Most people believe his lies.

In studies, I often hear people say, "I don't think God could love someone like me," and it cuts me every single time. I realize this comes from a misunderstanding because they think God is only looking for good people. In fact, God is looking for all people.

God loves the whole world, evidenced by the sacrifice of his Son, Jesus (John 3:16). John further explained, "In this is love, not that we have loved God but that he loved us and sent his Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10). Jesus died because I sinned. His blood covered my sins so I could stand in God's presence. Without the blood, I stand condemned by my sins.

My sins properly make me feel inadequate and unworthy to come before God. My lack of self-worth may cause me to buy into the devil's lie that God couldn't possibly love me. But he can and does, "God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8).

Recently, I talked to a 26-year-old man, who hated his life. He had been in prison, homeless, forgotten. He had five kids with three women, and two more on the way with two other women. He felt like God didn't want him. I told him

God did want him to be a father and a Christian. Nobody ever told him God wanted him.

The devil lies, "God doesn't want you." This lie is similar to the idea that God cannot love someone like me. However, it is amplified by the idea that God has no concern for me because I'm insignificant or too wicked. God cannot possibly have time for me in my sinful, worthless condition.

Before the creation God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness" (Gen. 1:26). God didn't need people; he wanted people. All people. Even knowing I would sin and bring guilt upon myself, God still wanted me. He devised the scheme of redemption to save me when I fell because he wanted me. Peter assures me, "The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (2 Pet. 3:9). God wants me.

The third truth is difficult for most people to believe. It is easier to believe the devil's lie that God "accepts them for who they are." A lot of people conflate love and acceptance, thinking if you love someone you accept them. However, acceptance isn't indicative of love, and love does not necessitate acceptance.

God loves me, but he does not accept me in my sins. Often, people say, "This is just who I am, accept me or walk away." But God doesn't accept me for who I am, he accepts me for what I become under his control.

God sent Jesus to save me from myself. David understood this, "The sacrifices of God are a broken spirit; a broken and contrite heart, O God, you will not despise" (Psa. 51:17). I don't come to God demanding he accept me as I am. I'm messed up by sin. I come humiliated by sin, seeking the grace of his re-creation in me. I beg him to turn me into something he can accept. And because he loves me, he gives the grace I need.

God loves me. God wants me. God cannot accept me for who I am, but for who I can be. These create my hope.
