**Jesus Is Coming, Look Busy

I once passed by a church, and was amused at their marquee message reading, “Jesus is coming, look busy.” I get that the sign was tongue-in-cheek and it does bring a chuckle. However, I fear that too many people follow this philosophy in their personal lives with God. They want to look busy when Jesus comes. So they fill their lives with busyness, but they don’t actually engage in the work of the Lord. They feel their busy schedule will dupe God.

First, it is good to see some people haven’t fallen asleep. As time progresses and the appointed day hasn’t arrived, many people are lulled into a sense of sleep. Some become like the scoffers in Peter’s letter, saying, “Where is the promise of his coming? For ever since the fathers fell asleep, all things are continuing as they were from the beginning of creation” (2 Pet. 3:4).

Second, it is good to see some people still anticipate Jesus’ return. Truly, Jesus is coming, and coming sooner than he was yesterday. Everyday that passes, is a day closer to the return of our Savior. The exact time is not known, “But concerning that day and hour no one knows, not even the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but the Father only” (Mat. 24:36), but as time marches on, the appointed time draws near.

The problem with the philosophy exposed by the marquee is the desire to “look busy.” There is a great difference between being busy and looking busy. Being

busy means actually engaging in God’s work (Eph. 2:10), practicing pure religion (Jas. 1:27), entering the harvest field (John 4:35), and offering in true worship (John 4:24). By putting hands to the plow and getting to work, people are busy (Luke 9:62). As the 19th century hymn reminds us,

There is much to do,
 There’s work on every hand.
 Hark! The cry for help
 Comes ringing thro’ the land;
 Jesus calls for reapers,
 I must active be,
 What wilt Thou, O Master?
 Here Am I, send me.

In contrast, looking busy gives the appearance of being busy, but in actuality, doing nothing. According to Paul, people who give the appearance of being busy are “busybodies.” “For we hear that some among you walk in idleness, not busy at work, but busybodies.” (2 The. 3:11). Busybody is translated from the Greek word periergadzomai, meaning to work all around; to go from one place to another, never getting any real work done. Paul said that such people are “working not at all!”

Does Jesus want his people to look busy or be busy? Clearly, he wants them to be busy—hard at work. Christians should possess Isaiah’s attitude when he said, “Here am I; send me” (Isa. 6:8).

Will God mistakenly think that the busybodies are hard workers? Will he be duped by those who look busy? “Be not deceived; God is not mocked: for whatsoever a man soweth, that shall he also reap” (Gal. 6:7). No. God will not be mocked or fooled into thinking that busybodies are busy people. Those who prepare for his coming will lose their souls if their preparation consists of looking busy, instead of getting busy.
