Where to start! This quarter of classes is probably going to be my favorite! Don't get me wrong, every class I get to spend learning about God's Word in some context has been a blast, including how to be successful in the work of ministry as a preacher-in-training! But 3/5 classes this guarter have been something I've been eagerly waiting to experience during my time here at school. Hermeneutics (how to interpret the Scriptures based on God's design), Denominational Doctrine, and Youth & Family Ministry. I remember when I was able to visit the school in April 2022 and sit in on Brett's YFM class. From the time spent in that class I immediately knew how beneficial it would be for me to learn from him in this context for the overall success I know we all desire to have as a member of the body of Christ. What we experience as people...
