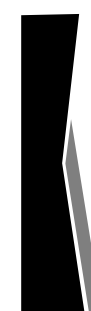

**Be Prepared
Sam Dilbeck**

“Be prepared” has been the Boy Scout motto since its inception in 1910. In application, scouts are to be prepared to assist those in need, to survive on their own, and to endure the zombie apocalypse. The ability to assist, survive, and endure is predicated upon having made the necessary preparations beforehand. This prepared mind set has caused scouts to render aid in the wake of many disasters and save countless lives.

Like the Scouts, the Christian’s motto should be, “Be prepared.” In fact, God exemplified preparedness. He prepared the earth and all that is in it (Gen 1:1). He prepared the man as a dresser for the earth (Gen 2:15). He prepared woman as the perfect complement to the man (Gen 2:18-24). He prepared the Law of Moses for the Israelites. He prepared Christ as the perfect sacrifice of all mankind. He has prepared it all for the salvation of mankind.

The Warning to “Be Prepared”

God has sounded the warning for man to be prepared. “Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an hour you do not expect” (Mat 24:44). “And that servant who knew his master’s will but did not get ready or act according to his will, will receive a severe beating” (Luke 12:47). The warning of preparation is based upon God’s promises.

God said sin reaps the wage of death and eternal damnation (Rom. 6:23). However, God promised people forgiveness of sins through the sacrifice of Jesus (1 John 2:2). This promise is made only to those who obey his commandments (Heb 5:9).

Thus, the warning is this: Prepare yourselves through obedience for the Judgment to come before it is too late. It is useless to prepare after the trumpets sound. It is futile to attempt preparation of the soul while standing before God’s throne. God warns us to prepare right now while we have life.



The Application of “Be Prepared”

We must apply our preparation in our everyday lives. First, we must be prepared to endure every situa-

tion, unto the very end (Rev 2:10). What are we doing to prepare ourselves for the next temptation to sin? How are we planning for our continued endurance? Have we made the necessary arrangements for our ultimate spiritual success? Like the Boy Scouts, are we prepared to meet each situation with righteous fortitude?

Second, we must be prepared to assist others. “Remind them... to be ready for every good work” (Titus 3:1). Good works include benevolence and edification. Of course, the ultimate good work is evangelism. As Christians we must be prepared to teach others about the story of God’s love through Christ (1 Pet 3:15). Such preparation comes through our personal prayer and study.

Finally, we must be prepared to survive the ultimate survival test—Judgment Day. We need to be doing everything possible right now to prepare ourselves for that day. “Therefore take up the whole armor of God, that you may be able to withstand in the evil day, and having done all, to stand firm” (Eph 6:13). Paul looked back over his own life and saw that he had “done all” to stand. This prompted him to write, “For I am already being poured out as a drink offering, and the time of my departure has come” (2 Tim 4:6). His preparation during this life made him ready to face death and Judgment.

The Reward of “Be Prepared”

We must be prepared to endure, assist, and survive, like good spiritual scouts. Unlike the boy scout who may receive a badge or commendation, our preparation will reap eternal, spiritual rewards. At death or some incapacitating injury or disease, we will no longer be able to prepare for Judgment. The only time we are guaranteed to have for preparation is now, tomorrow may be too late. So, what are you doing to be prepared?

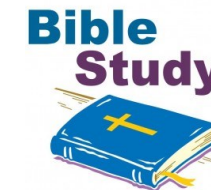
Farewell Potluck
