**Total Commitment

She was a lowly Gentile, but her declaration of faith rose above her Jewish contemporaries. Ruth’s testimony shone from the valleys of Moab to exemplify true faith. While many lessons can be gleaned from her life, her statement of faith challenges us to total commitment.

Too many people dabble in Christ. They inch to the edge to test his waters with their pinkie toe only to draw back in fear of total commitment. Yet, Christ said, “And he who does not take his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me” (Mat 10:38). Jesus desires total commitment from his followers.

Statement of Faith

When the widowed Naomi decided to return to Judah, she called her daughters-in-law, Ruth and Orpah, and informed them of her decision to leave. Orpah stayed in Moab with her people, but Ruth’s heart pushed her in a different direction. She objected to Naomi’s request that she stay in Moab declaring, “Do not urge me to leave you or to return from following you. For where you go I will go, and where you lodge I will lodge. Your people shall be my people, and your God my God. Where you die I will die, and there will I be buried. May the Lord do so to me and more also if anything but death parts me from you” (Ruth 1:16-17). Ruth touches on five articles of faith that are needed for total commitment to any cause.

Dedication

Ruth made a great sacrifice, pledging to leave everything to go wherever Naomi went. This pledge was motivated by love. Anything that charmed Ruth to stay was overshadowed by her love for Naomi.

Commitment demands going wherever Jesus commands. Dedicated disciples go to the world to evangelize (Mat. 28:19-20). They go through fiery trials (Mat. 20:22-23). They go to worship (Heb. 10:25). They go searching for those in need (Jas. 1:27; Gal. 6:10). Christians surrendered to Christ declare, “Wherever you go, I will go.”

Life
Ruth also pledged to live where Naomi lived. She trusted Naomi to lead her to a safe haven. She needed to stay with Naomi to receive these blessings, and that meant living however and wherever Naomi did.

Christians put their trust in the Prince of Peace to lead them to the safe haven. Just as David trusted, "He makes me to lie down in green pastures; he leads me beside the still waters" (Psa. 23:2). The safety of life rests in the hand of God. Jesus said, "If anyone loves me, he will keep my word, and my Father will love him, and we will come to him and make our home with him" (John 8:31). By following Jesus, we abide with God, pledging, "Wherever you lodge, I will lodge."

Fellowship
Ruth turned her back on her people and their ways. No longer would she live as a Moabite. She determined to live as a Jew with her Jewish mother, Naomi. Ruth desired to be one of God's children and proclaimed allegiance to Naomi and her people.

Today, Christians are God's chosen people. When one conforms to the image of Jesus, he is adopted by God into a new family—the family of the redeemed. God's people become his people and fellowship reigns (1 John 1:1-4).

Worship
Ruth witnessed Naomi's dedication to God. In stating her willingness to commit to Naomi's way of life, she pledges to accept Yahweh as her God. This means that she sought to worship the same God in the same way Naomi worshiped.

People seeking total commitment must make Yahweh their God. Worship him (John 4:24). Serve him (Mat. 4:10). Love must be demonstrated to glorify him as God (1 Cor. 16:14). They must declare that the eternal God is their God.

Death
Ruth committed to dying with Naomi's people. Naomi was older and naturally would have died before Ruth. But Ruth pledged to stay with the Jews even after Naomi's death. She dedicated her whole life to Naomi.

Total commitment from Christians means that they dedicate their whole lives to Jesus. Jesus died in his commitment to God. Christians willingly lay down their lives for God too (Rev. 2:10), and die to self (Rom. 6:6-8). The Christian promises must be a lifetime commitment, "Where you die, I will die."

Conclusion
In every age God has desired total commitment from his followers. A half-hearted attempt to serve him has destroyed the souls of millions of people. To give total commitment, one must give his dedication, life, fellowship, service, and death to God.
