Swing Away Sam Dilbeck

Many people consider baseball to be the perfect game with just the right combination of teamwork and individual accomplishment. Everyone can appreciate the teamwork, finesse, timing, and grace it takes to make a double-play, or triple-play. However, after all the strategy and teamwork, victory often comes through the skill of a single player. Nowhere is this more apparent than the batter's box, and there is nothing more disappointing than a batter watching three strikes and never trying to hit the ball.

In the game of life, many people step to the plate and get caught looking. Like a timid batter waiting for the perfect pitch, they wait for just the right conditions. Paralyzed by fear and doubt, they never take a chance and swing the bat. It's impossible to get a hit without swinging.

Ecclesiastes 9:11 warns us, "The race is not to the swift, nor the battle to the strong, nor bread to the wise, nor riches to the intelligent, nor favor to those with knowledge, but time and chance happen to them all." Life's uncertainty causes many people to hesitate or, worse, not even try. Knowing this was a possibility, the writer later encourages us, "Cast your bread upon the waters, for vou will find it after many days.... He who observes the wind will not sow, and he who regards the clouds will not reap" (Ecc. 11:1, 4). Instead of being paralyzed, we need to launch out with boldness and do something. Waiting for the stars to align and all the conditions to be right causes us to miss opportunities.

Sadly, many Christians are afraid to swing the bat. They fear saying the wrong thing in evangelism, so they never open their mouths. They feel uncomfortable around strangers, so they never greet others. They get nervous standing before people, so they never attempt to lead. They don't like change, so they never try something new. They get stuck in the rut of comfortability and never swing the bat. They never sow and never reap, which leads to starvation.

Reggie Jackson, Sammy Sosa, Alex Rodriguez, Derek Jeter, Mark McGuire, and Jose Canseco are some of the greatest sluggers in baseball. They're also in the list of most strikeouts. We shouldn't fear the strikeout as much as never trying, because we can only get a hit by swinging the bat.

Some say good things come to those who wait. The Bible says starvation comes to those who wait. Don't be afraid to take a swing.
