Time Is on My Side...not Sam Dilbeck

When your girl leaves, don't worry because time is on your side. At least that is what Jerry Ragovoy would have us believe in his ballad made famous by the Rolling Stones. Mick Jagger convinced us if he waited long enough, she would return because time was on his side. But, is time really on man's side? Could Mick be wrong?

Time is not on our side. It marches on relentlessly and stops abruptly. It is reported to be evil and having a proper view of time is essential to Christian living.

Once God did make time stand still. In Joshua 10, when the armies of the Amorites threatened Gibeon and Israel, God promised victory and caused the sun to stand still. Other than that, time has always moved forward despite Superman's lament at Lois Lane's first death. Time is molten lava creeping down the mountain consuming everything in its path, unstoppable, uncaring, and uncontrollable. As the seconds tick away the world ages and eternity draws nearer. Time is not on our side.

Solomon wrote about the effects of time on our bodies in Ecclesiastes 12. Time erases beauty, wrinkles skin, and turns hair grey (or turns hair loose as it does on some). The teeth fall out and strength fails. Paul said, "our outer self is wasting away" (2 Cor. 4:16). This doesn't even include the jaded spirit after years of disappointment and fading memories. Time is not on our side.

James then has the audacity to remind us that our time on this earth is short. He compares it to steam rising from a boiling kettle, "For you are a mist that appears for a little time and then vanishes." (Jas. 4:14).



After the Oklahoma City bombing in 1995, I got to see sketches of proposals for the memorial. One sketch in particular touched me. It had concentric circles of granite posts, each post representing a life. The posts were finished on all four sides, but the tops were left rough and jagged to represent a life broken off be-

fore it was finished. The poignancy was further expressed by the height of the posts, the shorter the post, the younger the life. Even without tragedy, life is short. Time is not on our side.

Then to top it all off, Paul says that time is evil. "Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil" (Eph. 5:15 -16). Paul was talking about the temptations a debased world impresses upon Christians. The longer we live, the more temptations we must endure—the greater chance we have of leaving the Christian life. Humans don't do well at waiting. He might also be referring to the Christian's task of personal work. Millions need the gospel and time is running out. The days are evil, and time is not on our side.

However, God is on our side, and he tells us how to use time wisely. We must use it for the good of our souls, looking forward to the day when we will have nothing but time. We must use time to seek and save the lost, the primary task of Christianity. We must use time to benefit our community through righteous activism. We must use time to glorify Christ to the nations. We must use what time we have until we have no more time left. And, even then, time will only be on our side if we used it wisely while on earth.
