The Power of One Sam Dilbeck

The day warmed as I looked down the hill to the looming prison walls capped by manned guard tower. For 17 years the stone and concrete separated Justin Taylor from the free world. But today, those doors would open, and he would walk into the arms of freedom. Six of us gathered on that summer day in 2015 in matching purple shirts to welcome him to his new life. Joy, anticipation, and anxiety gripped our group as we prayed and imagined what it would be like when he emerged.

At 25 Justin was unfocused and salty. He got arrested and accepted a deal for twenty years with the possibility of parole after ten. While in the Johnson County Detention Center he received a Bible correspondence course and from the depths of his self-loathing filled out the first lesson. He studied the passages, answered the questions, and asked a few of his own. In a few weeks he had received all the lessons and returned the last one with a note stating his desire for baptism.

Charlene Lowrance, a member of the LaPoynor Church of Christ in LaRue, Texas, opened the last lesson from Justin and delighted in his desire to be baptized. She found an address for the Granbury Street Church of Christ in Cleburne, Texas and asked if someone would go to the jail and baptize Justin. Tyler Young, the preacher, answered the call and met Justin. They studied and quickly became friends. Then Justin was baptized.

When Justin was transferred into prison, Tyler continued to write and visit him as Justin grew spiritually. When Tyler

moved to Mississippi, he told Ken Upchurch, one of the elders, about Justin. Ken began writing and visiting Justin.

Everywhere Tyler went he introduced people to Justin, his “prison” brother. He made new contacts for Justin, like the Savages from Roanoke, Texas, the Krugs from Hattiesburg, Mississippi, and the Provins from Weatherford, Texas. Christians everywhere began writing to encourage Justin. That is how I met him.

When his first parole was denied, many were saddened, but they kept encouraging. In an attempt to keep Justin’s spirits high, Tyler lamented the parole denial, but thought it would be granted soon. He even began ending his letters with the words, “Soon, brother. Soon.” For the next seven years the hope of parole came and went.

In February of 2015, Justin’s parole was approved. Ken Upchurch had been working on the release for years. Ken’s sister, Sherry, and her husband agreed to allow Justin to parole to their home in Weatherford. Ken bought him a truck. Tyler raised some seed money to help him start his new life. As our group gathered in purple shirts emblazoned with “Soon is Now,” I realized the small parts that so many played in getting us to that moment. That’s the power of one. For Charlene Lowrance, it was the act of licking one stamp that led to Justin’s salvation. She took the time to follow up with a prisoner nobody cared about.

When they announced the release, we moved to the closest point of the family waiting area and watched 139 parolees walk away from the stony walls and to families and friends. Tears watered the trees in the midst of the reunions. Then Justin stepped from the crowd of former prisoners and into the waiting arms of his brothers and sisters. His body was as free as his spirit.

Each of us has the opportunity to be a Charlene. A single deed, a kind word, or an honest prayer can change someone’s eternity. Let none of us deny our power—the power God gives us—but rather use it forever.
