Perhaps two of my favorite classes are happening this quarter and they are studying from the Gospel account by the apostle John and learning about Biblical Counseling. Counseling is an interesting concept and one that has its place even in the Scriptures. Galatians 6:1-2 highlights this kind of relational connection God wants His people to have and hold onto among each other. Yet it seems to remain perhaps one of the most difficult and challenging aspects of interpersonal connection. For example, the most common thing I've heard (and continue to hear) from people about this aspect of life is something to the effect of, "oh, well, I'm not a professional counselor so I can't really help you. But I'll be praying for you, and I hope you find the help you need." I don't know how exactly you will be cut to the heart by my bringing such...

...direct attention to that aspect of our relational experiences with each other, but it's my intention not to cause any stumbling. Rather, I'd like to encourage, if only for a moment, your consideration for the power of God's love in your life for the sake of counseling – whatever that may mean. This just may be my opinion, or perhaps my perceived insight based on past and current experiences, neither of which I am trying or intending to read into the Scriptures (because that would be wrong for me to do). But consider for a moment the concept of counseling through how God actualizes His love for you. What comes to mind? What about prayer? It is the most utilized means by which we communicate our needs and wants to God. But also, our feelings, desires, hurts, confusions, and so on. And what does God do? He listens! And that's really where this idea of counseling begins. Many times, the best thing we can do for one another is listen and then offer to pray together about the things that have been shared because there is no greater hand to hold the cares of our lives than the one who created them (:
