The Devil's Choices Sam Dilbeck

If I were the devil, I'd make every church look like Christ's church to confuse people. I wouldn't need them to worship me in satanic rituals; I would only need them to feel comfortable in confusion.

Paul warned, "Satan disguises himself as an angel of light" (2 Corinthians 11:14). The devil doesn't dress in red and carry a trident. He wraps himself in "near-Christianity," because he is a liar (John 8:44), and a wolf in sheep's clothing (Matthew 7:15-20). He doesn't turn people wicked, he just tricks them into thinking they are safe.

Jesus warns his followers to beware of the devil, because the devil builds churches to look like the true church. Then he lies, "One is just as good as another."

Paul disagreed, "There is one body and one Spirit—just as you were called to the one hope that belongs to your call—one Lord, one faith, one baptism, one God and Father of all" (Ephesians 4:4-6). Paul doesn't mean only one choice exists, but only one choice is right. For example, Jesus said no one could serve two lords. Jesus knew there were many lords, but he wanted us to choose the right lord. Some at Ephesus had been baptized twice (Acts 19:1-5). Yet, only one washed away their sins. The impact of Paul's statement is, "One is not as good as another. There is only one right one."



Three of these unifying statements concern the Trinity—Father, Son, and Spirit. Many religions don't follow false gods. Some reject the saving work of the Son. Others deny the proper work of the Holy Spirit in conviction, conversion, and sanctification. Still others replace God with creatures and idols. They make the wrong choice about God.

Another unifying doctrine is the one body, which according to Paul is the church (Ephesians 1:22-23; 5:23). There is only one church. A lot of people ignore that, but ignoring the truth doesn't change it, it just separates us from it. Many people make wrong choices about the church.

Paul also said that Christians share one hope. Most understand this to be the hope of reunion with God for eternity. Some, however, set their greatest hope on things of this earth—a new house, a better job, or more money. Like so many they are near sighted and cannot see a far off, and this leads them to make bad choices about their future.

Faith is also a unifying doctrine. Some understand this faith to refer to the object, system, or person someone believes in—one God. Others understand this to be the body of teaching itself—one gospel. Since Paul already invokes the Father, Son, Spirit, and the church, it seems more probable that he is speaking of the one gospel. In Galatians 1, Paul speaks of those who were turning from the gospel to another. They, like many today, looked for a different way leading to God. But there is only one that leads to God, and many make the wrong choice about the one faith.

If you want to cut through the devil's religious lies and find the one church, look at Paul's list of unity in Ephesians 4:4-6. Christ's church strives to make the right choice on each of these doctrines. In contrast, the devil's churches compromise at least one of them. His churches may hold on to the Trinity, but deny the necessity of baptism. Or, they may believe in the one baptism, but ignore the one church. The devil offers many wrong choices, but only Christ offers the right one.

At the Brighton Church of Christ we strive to conform to God's unifying doctrines. We invite you to join us each week as we reveal Christ and his church as the one hope for humanity.


