A Lofty Challenge

Have you ever played balloon volleyball, or just tried to keep a balloon in the air? Once launched, it doesn't take much to keep it in the air, but when left unattended it falls to the ground. Basically, because the air inside the balloon is close to the same density as the air outside, the balloon drifts slowly to the ground under the weight of the latex. Therefore, a gentle nudge, a quick tap, or even a blast of air is enough to keep the balloon afloat.

Sometimes, the church is like a balloon. It is launched by the power of God, but once its momentum stops, it begins to slowly fall back down. However, it doesn't take much to push it back up again. Usually, a well-placed nudge is enough to reverse its direction.

These nudges and taps may come in the form of encouragement from the elders or ministers, a special study, a challenge, an outreach event, or some other kind of spiritual boost. After the bump, the church soars again, but will eventually fall again.



But, what if we fill the balloon with helium? With helium, a balloon overcomes the weight of its material because the air inside is less dense and weighs less than the air

outside the balloon. Even as it loses its helium, it still floats and can be revitalized by a bump or even the addition of more helium.

For the church, it means filling it with a different kind of air. Of course the “air” is the people. If people in the church are just like people outside the church, the church will fall under its own weight. However, if we change our lives by changing our pursuits, concerns, fears, and definition of success, the people in the church become different—more spiritual as opposed to temporal.

Spiritually minded people are less dense and lighter than those who cling to carnal and temporal pursuits. Filling the church with more spiritual people will mean that less force is required to keep it floating. The Bible clearly says the church will be filled with both kinds of people because some Christians will change their direction and go back into the carnal ways.

So how do we keep Brighton floating? Two things. First, we need to fill the church with more spiritually led people than carnal people. This involves evangelism and conversion of people outside the church, and self introspection to determine if we are lifting, or weighing the church down. Second, we need to be encouragers—give the balloon a tap. When special events come, support them. As you see things sinking, shore them up.

As we work together to keep our works moving, Brighton has a bright future. But, if we become discouraged, disenchanted, or even just disengaged, our family will lose some altitude. Every Brightonian has a place in the family, and an opportunity to help keep us strong. Let’s keep up the good work. Keep the balloon aloft.

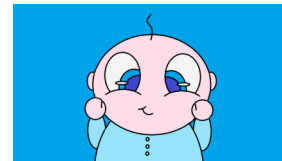
