Corona Psychology Sam Dilbeck

As the weeks pass during the corona scare, more and more people are starting to question the practices put in place. Some seek to balance the toll on the global economy against the toll on humanity. Others point out the dramatic overestimates of corona casualties. We are told to mask up. Then told masks don't help. As more and more people get tested, the death rate plummets. Basically, we are in a wait and see stance filled with unknowns and uncertainties.

This week, a pastor's death to coronavirus caused a stir. He often said, "God is larger than this dreaded virus." His faith caused him to trust in God, but he continued to follow the CDC guidelines, including social distancing and hygiene. In the end, he contracted the virus and died.

CNN Nightly News host, Don Lemon, used the death to scold people about flouting the guidelines. He spoke with authority and knowledge that nobody actually possesses. He specifically called out people of faith for disregarding CDC suggestions. Lemon's monologue sounds rational until the dots are connected.

The church that preacher worked for stopped meeting in person and used online avenues for internet worship. The preacher personally followed isolation and distancing practices. Despite following the guidelines, he still contracted the virus. This shows that the guidelines reduce risk, but do not eliminate risk. This case says nothing about what happens when you skirt the guidelines, since this pastor did not skirt the guidelines. It also reveals Don Lemon's bias against people of faith,

and, as his diatribe went on to mock President Trump, against Trump.

Too many people are capitalizing on coronavirus by exploiting fear of the unknown as Lemon did on CNN. Out of this media culture of fear and panic, Christians need to embrace the things we do know.

We know God is in control. It should be our daily mantra. God is in control. God is in control. God is in control. Does that mean Christians will not get sick? No. God was in control when Epaphroditus nearly died from his illness (Phil. 2:27). Though Paul had the miracle of healing, Epaphroditus was left to suffer through his illness. In the end, God had mercy on him, and he survived.

God allows sickness and disease to bring death as part of his plan. While we may not understand the fullness of his plan, we trust he is working all things for our good (Rom. 8:28). He uses things like coronavirus to turn people's hearts to him, or to strengthen the faith of his children, or even to punish the wicked and unbelieving—all according to his plan.

We also know Jesus is our salvation. Real salvation. While coronavirus may threaten our bodies, it cannot threaten our souls. Jesus warned us not to fear what harms the body, but what harms the soul (Mat. 10:28). Sin is the only real threat we face, and all of us have contracted that disease. We should not be disheartened though, because we know the cure for everyday sins—Jesus. Whether or not we ever get coronavirus, the answer for our sins is Jesus. As long as our souls are safe with him, no virus can truly harm us.

We know contracting coronavirus isn't a death sentence. While the virus does kill some people, the vast majority of people who get it live. In fact, most people who die from coronavirus also have other conditions that exacerbate the virus, similar to the influenza virus.

We should not cower in fear of the virus but take smart precautions. Social distance. Wash hands. Use sanitizer. Maintain health. Pray fervently. Don't listen to the media trying to push an agenda of fear, but have a healthy respect for the coronavirus, as you would the flu or any other cold virus.

Finally, trust God. He is in control and that's ultimately all we need to know.
