It’s easy to become overwhelmed at the thought of a big assignment or a difficult challenge. Sometimes the contemplation of a long and hard task makes us weary even before we begin. There are lots of 'little things' that are within my grasp, and they all add up to some really good and necessary accomplishments for the Lord. All I need is an attitude that says: "I can do that!"
